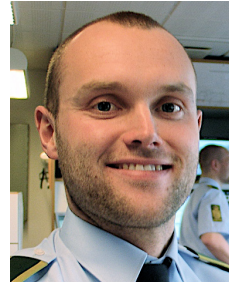

WORTH KNOWING

- About six percent of the population in Denmark has a non-Western background
- Only about one percent of the total police force has a non-Western background.
- The police training is in the process of becoming a so-called professional bachelor’s degree, which provides better opportunities to take a post-graduate degree (lang videregående uddannelse) at a later point.
- The police force has good job security. About 95 percent of those who start the police training will achieve permanent employment.
- About 75 police officers from the Danish police force are deployed in international missions where they, among other things, help establish police forces in other countries.
